

THE APPLICATION OF CONSOLIDATED OIL & GAS, INC.,
FOR A DUAL COMPLETION

ORDER NO. MC-1373

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 10, 1963 for permission to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 4-35 located in Unit F of Section 35, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NEM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 20th day of August, 1963, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waivers of objection have been received, from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 4-35 located in Unit F of Section 35, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NEM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

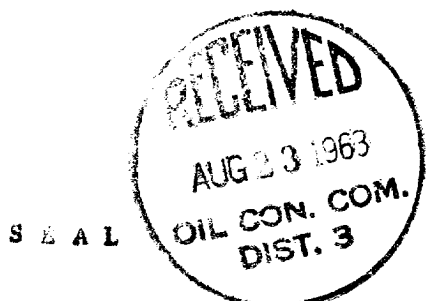
PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
