

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc. made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 29, 1963, for permission to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 5-25 located in Unit K of Section 25, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Pictured Cliffs Formation and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 18th day of September, 1963, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 5-25 located in Unit K of Section 25, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Pictured Cliffs formation and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE COMMISSION OF CONSERVATION

Under the provisions of Article 117-A, Consolidated Laws of New Mexico, the Commission of Conservation of the State of New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 29, 1963, for permission to drill a well in its Chamblin Well No. 1-22 located in Unit K of Section 13, Township 33 North, Range 4 West, NMMN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the fractured Gorda Blanco-Mesaville pool.

Now, on this 18th day of September, 1963, the Commission of Conservation of the State of New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission hereby orders:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Article 117-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operations of offset wells have been duly notified and that no objections have been received within the period as prescribed by said rules.
- (3) That the proposed well completion will not cause waste or impair conservative rights.
- (4) That the mechanics of the proposed well completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., and the same is hereby authorized to drill and complete the Chamblin Well No. 1-22 located in Unit K of Section 13, Township 33 North, Range 4 West, NMMN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the fractured Gorda Blanco-Mesaville pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply, observe, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Article 117-A.

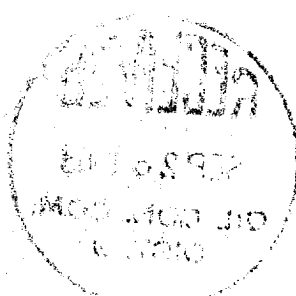
PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall make proper-lease tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test period for the Blanco-Mesaville pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That jurisdiction of this case is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
