

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 28, 1963, for permission to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 7-25 located in Unit H of Section 25, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 14th day of November, 1963, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Champlin Well No. 7-25 located in Unit H of Section 25, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

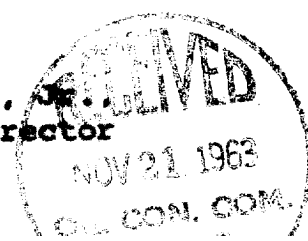
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

Under the provisions of Rule 11-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 28, 1953, for permission to drill completion well No. 7-25 located in Unit B of Section 32, Township 17 North, Range 4 West, W.M., Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated fracture in the pool and the Blanco-Messavado pool.

Now, on this 14th day of November, 1953, the Secretary of the Commission has received the following:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 11-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That satisfactory information has been received that all operators of other acreage have been duly notified and waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed final completion will not cause waste of oil or gas.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed final completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to drill completion well No. 7-25 located in Unit B of Section 32, Township 17 North, Range 4 West, W.M., Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated fracture in the pool and the Blanco-Messavado pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 11-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take action to cause cessation upon completion and annually thereafter during the annual deliverability test period for the Blanco-Messavado pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
