ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on April 17, 1959, for permission to dually complete its San Juan 27-5 Unit Well No. 41, located in the NE/4 SW/4 of Section 21, Township 27 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs formation.

Now on this 17th day of April, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its San Juan 27-5 Unit Well No. 41, located in the NE/4 SW/4 of Section 21, Township 27 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Pictured Cliffs formation through the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor inhibit
constructive type.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and
consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the application herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same
is hereby authorized to drill completion in San Juan 32-2 Unit Well No. 41,
located in the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 31, Township 31 North, Range 2 West, NMMP,
Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production
of gas from the Bilanco-Mesaverde Pool and the production of gas from an un-
assigned Pictured Cloud formation through the casing-tubing
annulus leasecively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that application shall complete, observe, and
produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section A, Rule 115-A,
as amended by Order R-154.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that application shall take proper steps
upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Delivery Period, Test
period for the Bilanco-Mesaverde Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That injunction of this cause is hereby
levied by the Commission for such longer period as may seem

necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after proper notice and hearing the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
