Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation is requesting a non-standard gas proration unit for Indian P #1, located 1386' FNL, 1236' FEL, Sec. 16, T 27N, R 3W, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

Indian P #1 is to be a dually completed well. It is an extension to the Blanco Mesa Verde Pool, and is classified as a wildcat in the Pictured Cliffs formation. The E/2 of Section 16 is dedicated to the Mesa Verde Drilling Block which contains 329.90 acres, and is caused by a variation in the legal subdivision.

Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation owns the leases on all of Section 16. Attached is the original registration receipt notifying Magnolia Petroleum Company, the only offset operator.

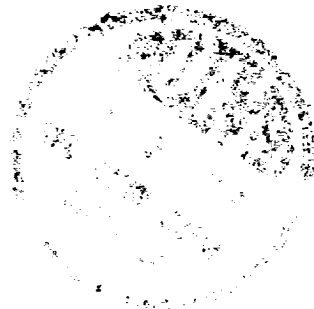

Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation is requesting a non-
standard gas production unit for Indian P-21, located 1560' ERL, 1560'
FRL, Sec. 16, T. 37N, R. 34E, Arapaho County, New Mexico.

Indian P-21 is to be a newly completed well. It is an extension
to the Blaine Mesa Verde Pool, and is classified as a "wildcat" in the
unproved Giff's formation. The 1/2 of Section 16 is located to the
west of the well which contains 32.50 acres, and is caused
by a variation in the legal subdivision.

Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation owns the lease on all of
Section 16. Attached is the original registration receipt notifying
Ranchos Petroleum Company, the only other operator.
