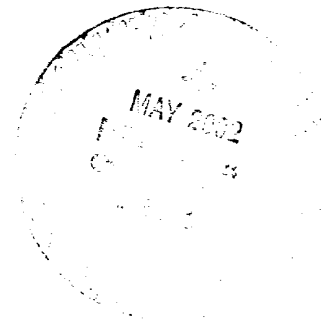

Attached is a copy of the allocation for the recompletion of the subject well that was completed 6-22-01. DHC-268az was issued for this well.

Gas: Mesaverde 65%
Dakota 35%

Oil: Mesaverde 50%
Dakota 50%

These percentages were calculated using rate-time reserve estimate comparisons for each respective formation. Because condensate production nearly doubled since the Mesaverde formation was added, the oil allocation has been equally split between the Mesaverde and Dakota formations.
