

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL
GAS COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-2149

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 15, 1974, for permission to dually complete its San Juan 27-4 Unit Well No. 126, located in Unit L of Section 20, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 16th day of October, 1974, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that there are no other operators of offset acreage.

(3) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

(4) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its San Juan 27-4 Unit Well No. 126, located in Unit L of Section 20, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL
GAS COMPANY FOR A COURT ORDER

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 18, 1974, for permission to drill and operate its San Juan No. 128, located in Unit 3 of Section 30, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool and from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool.

Now, on this 18th day of October, 1974, the Secretary-Commissioner:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided to the Commission and that there are no other persons of effect adverse to the proposed drilling and completion of the well;
- (3) That the proposed drilling and completion will not impair the rights of other persons;
- (4) That the mechanism of the proposed drilling and completion is feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, is hereby authorized to drill and complete its San Juan No. 128, located in Unit 3 of Section 30, Township 27 North, Range 4 West, NMM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool and from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool through a well to be drilled.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply with the provisions of Rule 113-A and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall have a shut-in period of 90 days upon completion and annually thereafter during the period of shut-in for the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That completion of this well is hereby required for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
