

Dear Mr. Papp:

We have reviewed your application to commingle downhole production from the Blanco Mesaverde and Basin Dakota formations in the following well:

Rincon Unit No. 174M 1775' FNL, 1540' FWL Section 19, T. 27 N., R. 6 W. Rio Arriba County, New Mexico

Due to the mechanical problems encountered during the completion of the well, which precludes individual testing of the two zones, we concur that the most equitable way to allocate production is the average of previously approved allocations surrounding Unit Well 174M. The previously approved wells and their respective allocation factors are all located nearly equal distances from Unit Well 174M.

We reviewed the allocation factors, Natural Gas: Mesaverde 41% Dakota 59% and Liquid Hydrocarbons: Dakota 100%, and found these factors to be accurate.

Your application is hereby approved effective September 23, 1992. Please comply with New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (NMOCD) guidelines when reporting the allocated production.

Under provisions of 43 CFR 3165.3, you may request an Administrative Review of the order(s) described above. Such requests, including all supporting documents, must be filed in writing within 20-business days of receipt of this notice and must be filed with the State Director, Bureau of Land Management, P. O. Box 27115, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87502-0115. Such requests shall not result in a suspension of the order(s) unless the reviewing official so determines.
