
Dear Ms. Maddox:

Reference is made to your application dated February 8, 1998, which was received by the Division in Santa Fe on February 12, 1998, for an unorthodox "infill" gas well location in both the Blanco-Mesaverde and Basin-Dakota Pools for the proposed San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 214-M to be drilled 870 feet from the South line and 270 feet from the East line (Unit P) of Section 4, Township 27 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

Gas production attributed to said well from both pools is to be included in the existing standard 320.17-acre gas spacing and proration units comprising Lots 1 and 2, the S/2 NE/4, and the SE/4 (E/2 equivalent) of said Section 4. The Mesaverde production is currently dedicated to Conoco's San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 82 (API No. 30-039-07201), located at a standard gas well location 1190 feet from the North and East lines (Lot 1/Unit A) of said Section 4, and the Dakota production is currently dedicated to the San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 214 (API No. 30-039-20861), located at a standard gas well location 1510 feet from the North line and 1040 feet from the East line (Unit H) of said Section 4.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the "General Rules for the Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool/Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the above-described unorthodox "infill" Dakota/Mesaverde gas well location for the San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 214-M is hereby approved.
