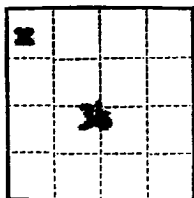

DETAILS OF WORK

To drill & test subject well to the Gallup SS. Surface Casing: 9-5/8" OD 32.3' H-40 casing to be set at approx. 220' KB & cemented with 175 sac & circulated to surface. LOG 24 hours. Production Casing: 5 1/2" OD 114', J-55 casing to be set through the lowest producing zone. Use centralizers & rotating type scrubbers through the Gallup and cement with 125 sac with 35 gal. Coring: Full size hole from 1560' to 5110'. Drilling: NST if content of sands based on electric log is questionable. Logging: Electric log from TD to surface casing. Detail from TD to 1000' above TD. Lateralog & Microlog same as Detail KB. Drilling Time: Use Geolograph from 210' to TD. Drift Surveys: at 50' intervals to 100'; thereafter at 250' intervals. Depth Measurements: SIA of drill pipe at approx. 150' above the Mameo, prior to NST, and at TD. Sampling: Collect 10' samples from 1000' to TD. Completion Program: Whenever practicable, completion will be with rotary.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

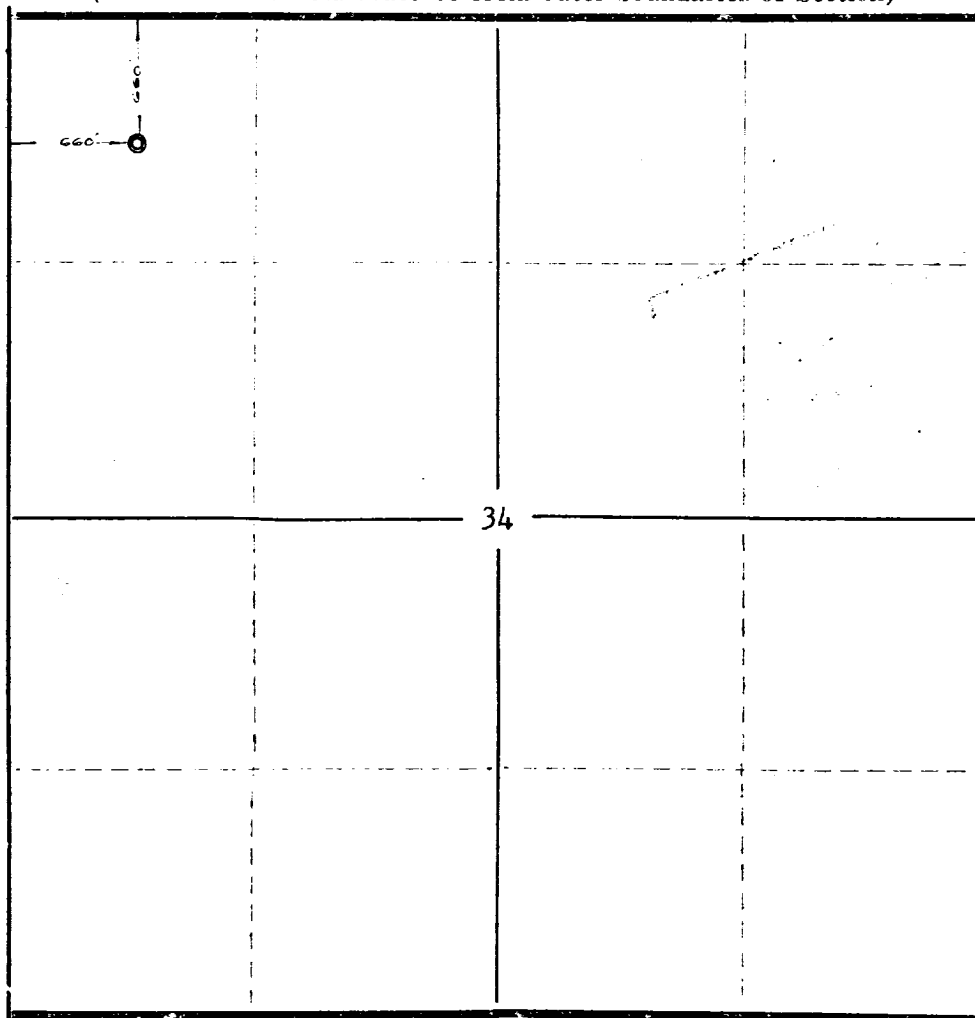
