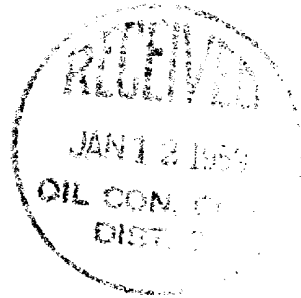

BERGER WELL NO. 2, LOCATED IN THE NW/4 NW/4 OF SECTION 23, TOWNSHIP 26 NORTH, RANGE 11 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM AN UNDESIGNATED DAKOTA FORMATION AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE GALLUP FORMATION ADJACENT TO THE GALLEGOS GALLUP POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Tennessee Gas Transmission Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on December 15, 1958, for permission to dually complete its (U.S.A) W. O. Berger Well No. 2, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 23, Township 26 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of gas from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Gallegos Gallup Pool.

Now on this 8th day of January, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

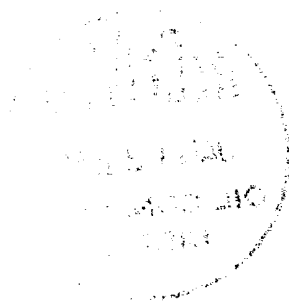
- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Tennessee Gas Transmission, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its (U.S.A) W. O. Berger Well No. 2, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 23, Township 26 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of gas from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Gallegos Gallup Pool through the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Gas-Oil Ratio Test Period for the Gallegos-Gallup Pool.

Well No. 2, located in the NW 1/4 of Section 23, Township 26 North, Range 11
West, NIMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit
the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production
of gas from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Gallup Gallup Pool.

Now on this 6th day of January, 1955, the Secretary-Treasurer of the

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 12-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, and
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all other wells of other owners have been duly notified and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste or impairment of correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Tennessee Gas Transmission, Inc., the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its (U.S.A.) W. O. Berger Well No. 2, located in the NW 1/4 of Section 23, Township 26 North, Range 11 West, NIMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of gas from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Gallup Gallup Pool, the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section 12-A, as amended by Order 12-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall make proper-bearing tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Gas-Oil Ratio Test, and shall file the results of such tests with the Secretary-Treasurer of the Commission.
