

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 11-A, Wynn & Brooks made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 12, 1954, for permission to drill a dual completion in Federal 1 Well No. 1 located in Unit 8 of Section 11, Township 37 North, Range 8 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Chaco formation and the Blanco-Masavenda Pool.

Now, on this 4th day of June, 1954, the Secretary-Director

finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 11-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rules.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and conform with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Wynn & Brooks, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill a dual completion in Federal 1 Well No. 1 located in Unit 8 of Section 11, Township 37 North, Range 8 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Chaco formation and the Blanco-Masavenda Pool, through parallel strings of casing.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that applicant shall comply, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 11-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take proper steps to protect against corrosion and similarly hazardous.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
