Gentlemen:

By means of this letter we wish to request administrative approval for the non-standard locations of the captioned wells. The two wells are inside the 130' requirement distance from the quarter - quarter section line in their respective sections.

The Armour Federal #1 and the Grigsby #1 were originally staked as normal locations. However, the wells are on land that is part of the Navajo Indian Irrigation Project. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (see enclosed letter) requested that the locations be moved to the present sites so as to cause the least amount of interference with the proposed sprinkling activities in the area. The attached map shows that the Bureau of Indian Affairs plans to run their main water supply line along the quarter - quarter section lines and route their sprinkler systems perpendicular to this main supply line. If the wells are located close to the supply line then they will not interfere with the sprinklers.

All offsetting lease holders (see attached map) have been notified by certified mail. Since these wells are within spacing regulations concerning outer boundaries of the lease, we do not feel that approval of these locations will cause any harm to offsetting lease holders.

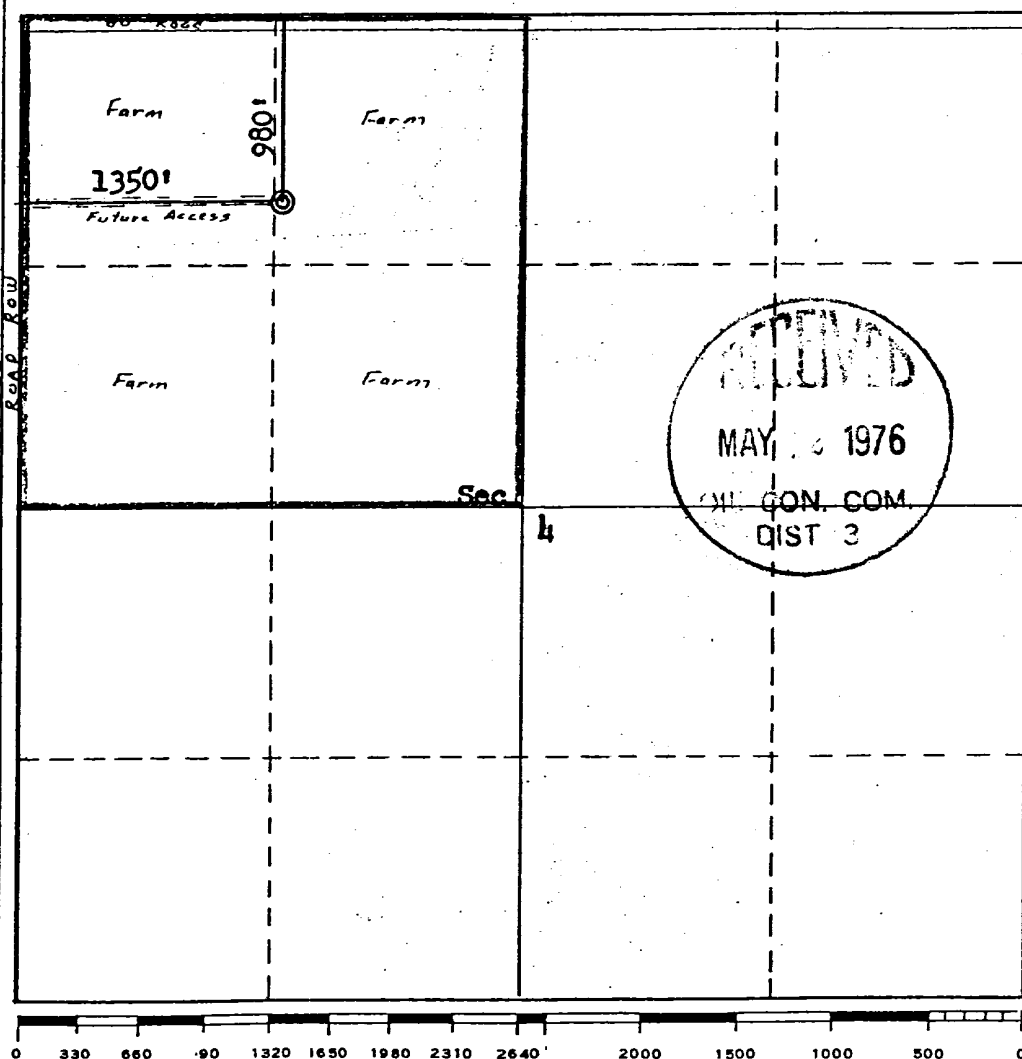

The Navajo Indian Irrigation Project is now being developed as an all-sprinkler irrigation project.

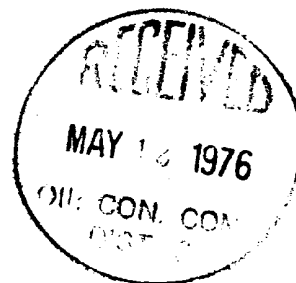
In order to cause the least amount of interference with sprinkling activities it is necessary to locate some oil and gas wells at locations other than standard.
