DETAILS OF WORK

Well was drilled to a total depth of 2100 feet with rotary tools. Cable tool rig moved onto well and well cleaned out to bottom. On natural test with 2" orifice well tester, well tested 93.6 MCF per day.

Well was plugged back with pea gravel from 2100 to 2056 and was shot with 575 quarts SNG from 1989 to 2056 on June 14, 1951. Well was cleaned out to bottom. 1-1/4" tubing was landed at 2066. Well was shut in 72 hours. After 3 hour blow down, well measured 734 MCF per day through siphon string with pitot tube through 2" pipe nipple June 19, 1951.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to inform you of the results of the recent visit to the Philippines by the Secretary of Defense, Mr. Robert McNamara. The visit was made from October 15 to October 25, 1964, and was the first by a U.S. Secretary of Defense since the end of World War II. The Secretary of Defense was accompanied by a delegation of high-ranking officials from the Department of Defense, including the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy, Mr. Robert A. McNamara, Jr., and the Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs, Mr. John Edgar Hoover.

2. The Secretary of Defense was received by the President of the Philippines, Mr. Diosdado C. Macapagal, and the Vice President, Mr. Fernando S. Marcos. The Secretary of Defense also met with the members of the Philippine Cabinet and the members of the Philippine Congress.
