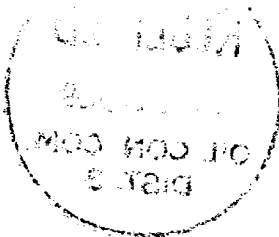

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL GAS PRODUCTS COMPANY FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS FRONTIER "B" WELL NO. 2, LOCATED IN THE NW/4 NW/4 OF SECTION 9, TOWNSHIP 27 NORTH, RANGE 11 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM AN UNDESIGNATED DAKOTA FORMATION AND THE PRODUCTION OF OIL FROM AN UNDESIGNATED GALLUP FORMATION.

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER**  
**OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) El Paso Natural Gas Products Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 14, 1959, for permission to dually complete its Frontier "B" Well No. 2, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 9, Township 27 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of oil from an undesignated Gallup formation.

Now on 14th day of May, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

(3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

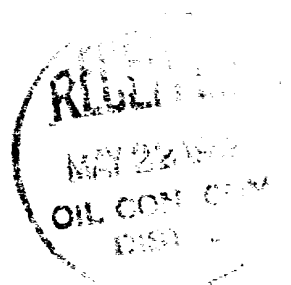
(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Products Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Frontier "B" Well No. 2, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 9, Township 27 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of oil from an undesignated Gallup formation through parallel strings of tubing.

**PROVIDED HOWEVER,** That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

**PROVIDED FURTHER,** That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Dakota Gas Zone.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 11-2 of the El Paso Natural Gas Products Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 14, 1934, for permission to dual zone its Frontier "B" Well No. 2, located in the NW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 21 North, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M., in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of oil from an undesignated Gulf formation.

Now on this day of May, 1934, the Oil Conservation Director finds:

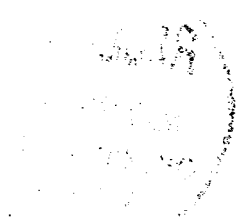
- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Section 10 of Rule 11-2 of the Conservation Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That the applicant has furnished the information required by the provisions of the said Rules and Regulations.
- (3) That the applicant has been duly notified and of effect thereof have been duly notified and
- (4) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rules.
- (5) That the proposed dual zone operation will not cause waste nor in part
- (6) That the neediness of the proposed dual zone operation is feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Products Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dual zone its Frontier "B" Well No. 2, located in the NW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 21 North, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M., New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota formation and the production of oil from an undesignated Gulf formation through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That application shall be complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section 11-2, Rule 11-2, as amended by Order 8-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That application shall file the water-lease tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the annual delivery test period for the Dakota Gas Lease.



**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:** That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after proper notice and hearing the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
