DETAILS OF WORK

On July 18, 1951, at 11:44 A.M., 5-1/2" casing was set at 1401 feet with 75 sacks. Rotary rig was moved off of location and cable tool rig rigged up for drilling cement plug and pay. On July 29, 1951, hole was bailed dry and remained dry for two hours. Twenty-six feet of solid cement was then drilled to bottom of pipe and hole again bailed dry. Hole remained dry for two hours when was considered a satisfactory water shut-off test.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
