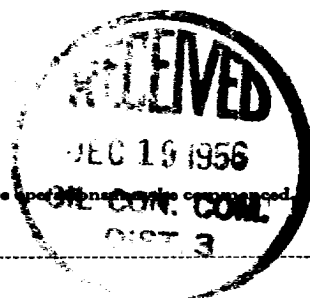
Moved in cable tools and blew down well. Pulled tubing and strung in with bailer to 2108'. Drilled, bailed, and cleaned out to 2136'. Sand-water treated open hole 2072' to 2136' through 7 inch casing with 30,000 pounds of sand. Drilled, bailed, and cleaned out to 2131'. Ran 1 inch, 1.68# tubing and landed at 2116', K.B.; perforations 2099' to 2113', jet nipples 1760' and 1887' and 2014'. Moved off cable tools.
