APPLICATION

Congress Oil Company (herein referred to as "Applicant"), a Colorado corporation with its principal place of business in the Burt Building, Dallas 1, Texas, hereby makes application to the Secretary of the Commission for an order granting approval of an exception to Rule 6(A) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool, promulgated by the Commission in its Order No. R-565, as amended, in establishment of the non-standard gas proration unit described hereinbelow; and in support of such application Applicant respectfully states and shows the following:

(1) The non-standard gas proration unit for which approval is sought herein consists of 164.12 contiguous surface acres substantially in the form of a rectangle, and consists of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 18, Township 28 North, Range 10 West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico.

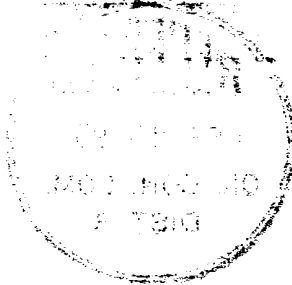
(2) The non-standard size of the tract is due to a variation in legal subdivision of the U. S. Public Lands Surveys.

(3) The well for which it is requested that the above described acreage be the gas proration unit is the Congress-Lachman #3, which well is located 990 feet north of the south line and 990 feet east of the west line of the aforesaid Section 18.

(4) In the opinion of Applicant, the entire non-standard gas proration unit proposed herein may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas from the Pictured Cliffs Formation.
