DETAILS OF WORK

9-5/8" casing set at 910' with 155 sacks. Well blew out 8 hours later behind pipe. Pumped 300 sacks mud and 250 sacks cement through Bradenhead. Tested pipe 600# for 30 min. No drop. Tested water shut off 500# for 15 min. No drop.
