Pull tubing, set CIBP at $\pm 7500'$, spot/dump bail 50' cement on top of CIBP, fill the wellbore with an inhibited fluid, and pressure test the casing to 500 psi to temporarily abandon the well. Pending evaluation for uphole recompletion potential.

Anticipate work to be completed in 1994. Will contact Mark Kelly 48 hours prior to commencing any abandonment operations.
