Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application for approval of an unorthodox well location for your San Juan 29-7 Unit Well No. 63 to be located 1480 feet from the North line and 600 feet from the East line and in the SE/4 NE/4 of Section 10, Township 29 North, Range 7 West, Blanco Mesaverde Pool, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

It is our understanding that this unorthodox well location is based upon extreme topographic conditions in the NE/4 of said section.

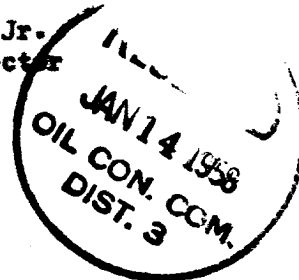
Inasmuch as you furnished waivers from the offset operators, it is possible for immediate approval to be granted. Therefore, by authority granted me under provisions of Rule 104 (f) of the Rules and Regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission, you are hereby granted an exception to Rule 1 (c) of Order R-110 for the above described unorthodox well location. You must also obtain like approval from the U. S. Geological Survey, if this well is to be drilled on Federal Lands.

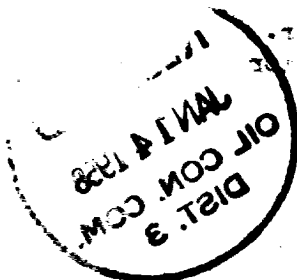
