Phillips plans on using the ratio method from November 2001 production throughout the life of the well. Based on historical production values, we believe this will be the most accurate method of allocating production. Attached is the historical data that we used to determine the ratio of 77% to be allocated to the Mesaverde and 23% to be allocated to the Dakota for gas production. The oil production will be allocated at 100% Mesaverde and 0% Dakota.
