

CONSTITUTION
OF THE UNITED STATES
OF AMERICA

Article I

Section 1
All legislative
Powers herein granted
shall be vested
in a Congress of the
United States, which
shall consist of a
Senate and House of
Representatives.

Section 2

The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the State in which he shall be chosen.

Representatives and electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3

Section 4
The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Representatives shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or alter the Times, Places or Manner of holding such Elections, when it may be necessary for the United States.

Section 5

Section 6
The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall be held on the first Monday of December, unless they shall by Law appoint a different Day.
