

THE APPLICATION OF TENNECO OIL
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1742

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Tenneco Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 21, 1966, for permission to dually complete its Florance Well No. 24 located in Unit A of Section 23, Township 29 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 2nd day of November, 1966, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waiver of objection has been received from the offset operator and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Tenneco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Florance Well No. 24 located in Unit A of Section 23, Township 29 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

THE APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT TO
CONDUCT A TEST COMPLETION

INVESTIGATION ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Where the operators of Well 112-A, Texaco Oil Company made an application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 21, 1966, for permission to drill a completion well No. 12 located in Unit A of Section 27, Township 33 North Range 3 West, N.M.P. San Juan County, New Mexico, to such a manner as to produce gas from the Blaine-Reservoir Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 27th day of November, 1966, the Executive Director finds:

- (1) That application was made in accordance with the provisions of Rule 11-4 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information was furnished that all operators of offset wells have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waiver of objection has been received from the offset operator and the waiver permit as prescribed in said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion well will cause waste and impact on conservative rights.
- (5) That the location of the proposed well complies with the provisions and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Texaco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill a completion well No. 12 located in Unit A of Section 27, Township 33 North Range 3 West, N.M.P. San Juan County, New Mexico, to such a manner as to produce gas from the Blaine-Reservoir Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool in the manner and the manner hereby.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 11-4.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall file a water-leakage test report on completion and annually thereafter with the Annual Delivery Report filed for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the purpose of such further order as the Commission may deem necessary.
