Perf'd 3047-62' with 2 SPF. Spearheaded frac with 100 gallons 10% acetic acid and 1,260 gallons treated water with 0.8% KCl and 7 pound gel per 1000 gallons. Sand-water fraced with 25,000 gallons water, treated as above, and 30,000 pounds 10-20 sand. Injection pressures 2400-2200. Average injection rate 25 BPM. Opened well to the atmosphere 20 hours and would not unload. Put three soap sticks in tubing and shut the well in 23 hours. Opened well and well started unloading. Alternately shutting in and blowing well to clean up.

Instructions

Any necessary special instructions concerning the use of this form and the number of copies to be submitted, particularly with regard to local, area, or regional procedures and practices, either are shown below or will be issued by, or may be obtained from, the local Federal and/or State office.
