Administrative Order NSL-2575-A

Dear Mr. Winkler:

Reference is made to your application dated September 26, 1997, as supplemented by letter dated October 1, 1997, for an unorthodox Ojo Alamo gas well location for your existing Jicarilla 459 Well No. 3 (API No. 30-039-24306), which was drilled in 1988 and completed in the East Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool at an unorthodox gas well location (approved by Division Administrative Order NSL-2575, dated September 14, 1988) 1658 feet from the North line and 1901 feet from the East line (Unit G) of Section 18, Township 30 North, Range 3 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

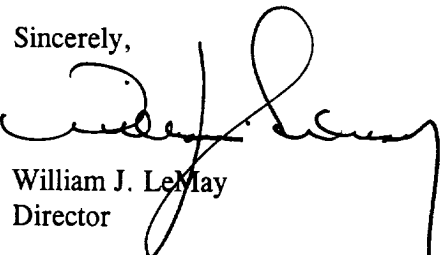
It is our understanding that the Pictured Cliffs interval will be properly plugged back and said well will be recompleted to the Ojo Alamo formation, which pursuant to Division General Rule 104.B(2)(a) said well location is considered to be unorthodox for a wildcat Ojo Alamo gas test. Further, the NE/4 of said Section 18 is to be dedicated to the well to form a standard 160-acre gas spacing and proration unit.

The application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 104.F of the General Rules and Regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division General Rule 104.F(2), the above-described unorthodox Ojo Alamo gas well location is hereby approved.

Further, all provisions of said original Order NSL-2575 shall remain in full force and affect until further notice.
