ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) Aztec Oil & Gas Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on February 5, 1973, for permission to complete for salt water disposal its Central Totah Unit Well No. 19, located in Unit L of Section 34, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified; and
3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 701 (C) will be met.
4. That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, is hereby authorized to complete its Central Totah Unit Well No. 19 located in Unit L of Section 34, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Totah-Gallup formation at approximately 5544 feet to approximately 5596 feet through 2-3/8 inch tubing with a packer set at approximately 5400 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all other operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified and
3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 101 (C) will be met.
4. That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, SALT WATER DISPOSAL COMPANY, is hereby authorized to complete its Central Trench Unit No. 19 located in Unit 3 of Section 34, Township 22 North, Range 13 West, T12N, R13W, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Trench-Gully formation at approximately 5000 feet to approximately 5500 feet through 2-3/8 inch tubing with a packer set at approximately 5200 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 104 and 112 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
