ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Pan American Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on March 10, 1960, for permission to dually complete its Gallegos Canyon Unit Well No. 86, located in the SE/4 NE/4 of Section 35, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from an undesignated Gallup Oil Pool adjacent to the Totah-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 30th day of March, 1960, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Gallegos Canyon Unit Well No. 86 located in the SE/4 NE/4 of Section 35, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from an undesignated Gallup Oil Pool adjacent to the Totah-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

on March 10, 1960, for permission to drill completion 36, Towardip 36 North,
Unit Well No. 86, located in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 36, Towardip 36 North,
Range 13 West, N.M., San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as
to permit the production of oil from an undesignated Gullip Oil Pool adjacent
to the Total-Gullip Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated
Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 30th day of March, 1960, the Secretary-Director

finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub
Section 'c' of Rule 115 A of the Conservation & Rules and Regulations.

(2) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub
Section 'c' of Rule 115 A of the Conservation & Rules and Regulations.

(3) That no objection has been received within the mailing period
of fifteen days from the date of filing.

(4) That the proposed unit completion will not cause waste nor in-
hibit conservation rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed gas completion is feasible
and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation,
be duly advised to proceed authority to drill completion 36, Towardip 36 North,
Range 13 West, N.M., San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as
to permit the production of oil from an undesignated Gullip Oil Pool adjacent
to the Total-Gullip Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated
Dakota Pool promptly without notice of supply.

Order No. DC-925

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PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Dakota Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
