the present condition of the well and indicate what your intentions are in the future for either returning the well to production or permanently plugging and abandoning it. If the well is to be temporarily abandoned for a relatively short period of time we will allow you to leave in its present condition providing the casing and wellhood equipment are in good condition. If you intend to abandon it for an extended period we will require that a cement plug be set in the bottom of the well to protect the pay formation and also that the well be capped in some fashion, either with a metal cap or a cement plug at the top of the casing.
