Dear Mr. Kenaston:

We understand that you have drilled a well to the Pictured Cliffs sand on the above described quarter section. This office has not approved this location, since your Notice of Intention to Drill did not show the required amount of acreage allocated to the well. The New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Order No. 748 requires that a drilling unit in the Fulcher-Kutz Field contain 160 acres and be a normal quarter section of the Public Land Survey. Your application shows only 120 acres allocated to this well, omitting the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$; and therefore does not conform with Order No. 748.

This well should not have been drilled until your Notice of Intention to Drill had been approved. Although the well is drilled, you cannot be allowed to produce it until you have communitized the full 160 acres or have a special Oil Conservation Order granting you an exception.

You are hereby notified not to produce the subject well until you have properly fulfilled the requirements of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.
