Reference is made to your inquiry of January 5, 1959, concerning the status of Marshall Drilling Company Well No. 1, Section 13, Township 29 North, Range 11 West, San Juan County, New Mexico.

The above-described well is shut-in for failure to file production reports and well test reports as required by Commission Rules and Regulations, not because the plugging bond premiums have not been paid.

The Commission has no power to require the payment of premiums for plugging bonds. The matter of payment of premiums is a private transaction between principal and surety, and as such outside the scope of the police powers under which the Commission operates.
