
Baker Model "B" packer at 4912

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DIVISION APPROVED PLUGGING PROGRAM

- Release packer and pull same. 1.
- Go back in hole with tubing to plug back TD at 5081' 2. and set a cement plug 5081' to 4931'.
- Pull out of cement with tubing and reverse out with water to make sure tubing is clear. Wait on cement a 3. minimum of 4 hours and tag plug. If plug is at 4980 or above go to step 4. If not, fill to 4931.
- Come out of hole with tubing and pressure up on 4. to 500 PSI to insure mechanical integrity. If leaks go in hole with packer and locate hole.
- Squeeze with a miinimum of 30 sacks of cement leaving 5. 100' of cement inside casing.
- If casing does not have a leak perforate casing at 6 2500' and set a cement plug 2500' to 2400' in and outside casing to isolate Mesaverde.
- Pull out of hole to 950' and set a cement plug 950' to 7. 750' inside casing.
- Pull out of hole to 250' and set a cement plug 8. 250'-150' inside casing.
- Set a top plug and dry hole marker. 9.
- Fill pits, clean and level location.

All plugs will be with neat cement with or without an accelerator.





In response to a telephone call from Frank Chavez, Supervisor of our Aztec District Office, wherein he advised that a bond issued to the Bureau of Land Management under the name of Paramount Petroleum Company was a bogus plugging bond, I checked into the bond we are holding for Paramount. Apparently this bond is no good as National Surety Corporation has been unable to find any record of the individuals signing this bond as representatives of the insurance company.

Since there are many wells outstanding on this bond, the cost to the State is going to be tremendous.

Please look into what we can do and I would appreciate your advising me of the action you plan to take.
