Frank:

As per our recent telephone conversation, attached is shut-in pressure data from our recently completed City of Farmington Com #1 Dk well located in Farmington, New Mexico. This well and the City of Farmington Com #2 Dk well supply gas to the City of Farmington's Animas Power Plant. As required, the well was shut-in following the flow period for its state deliverability test. However, the #2 well alone could not supply the power plant with a sufficient volume of gas to sustain operations and the #1 well was turned on after 123.5 hours of shut-in. As the shut-in pressures indicate, the well had stabilized at 1315 Psig for three days prior to returning to production.

Tenneco requests that the stabilized 1315 Psig shut-in pressure be allowed as the official shut-in pressure for the state test. Please advise Tenneco of your decision in this matter. If further data is needed, please call me at (303) 740-2555.
