Reference is made to your letter of January 29, 1960 regarding ownership transfer of the R.E. Jackson #2 Sullivan well in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 30, T9N-10W to Alfred E. McLane, 1900 Mercantile Dallas Building, Dallas, Texas.

You have stated in your letter that Form C-103 showing ownership transfer was being sent to Mr. McLane for signature and forwarding to this office. We have never received this form from Mr. McLane and cannot relieve you of plugging responsibility until such time as the well is legally covered under Mr. McLane's bond and the ownership transfer has been effected according to our rules.

In this connection the Oil Commission is at the present time reviewing the status of temporarily abandoned wells in this district, the purpose being to force the plugging of wells, in those cases where the operator fails to show the reason for the temporary abandonment. In cases where it is the intention to re-enter the well and deepen to other producing zones and if the well is properly cased and cemented so that waste does not occur during the period the well is temporarily abandoned it may be possible to delay plugging operations.

We need such a report of intention from either you or Mr. McLane for the above-named well and in the event it is not forthcoming we will have to require that this well be plugged according to New Mexico Oil Commission Rules and Regulations.


With reference to the R. E. Jackson No. 2 Sullivan Well, in the NW/4 SW/4 Sec. 30, 29N-10W, San Juan County, New Mexico, which was transferred from R. E. Jackson to Alfred E. McLane, I regret to inform you that Mr. McLane was accidentally killed in a traffic accident last week.

Prior to his passing, Mr. McLane had handed me your letter of February 17 and asked me to make a decision as to whether the well should be plugged and abandoned or further testing attempted. I am planning to contact Pan American, who are co-owner of the well, or at least are in the drilling unit, and ask them their views in the matter. There are numerous other matters in connection with his estate of a similar nature, so that it will probably be 30 days before I can get anything done, but I will do my best to advise you at least of our intent by that time. I hope that this will meet with your approval.
