DETAILS OF WORK


The well was spudded at 2:00 P.M., September 12, 1952. In September 12, 1952, 9-5/8" casing was landed at 251 feet and cemented with 725 sacks of cement. Plug down at 12:59 P.M., September 12, 1952. At 11:30 P.M., September 14, 1952, casing and water shut-off were tested at 500 pounds for 30 minutes with no drop in pressure. Forty-five feet of solid cement were drilled in bottom of pipe and water shut-off was again tested at 500 pounds for 30 minutes. There was no drop in pressure during this test and drilling operations were resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
