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This survey was conducted on October 27, 1976 by Billy J. Naylor of New Mexico State University (Federal Antiquities Permit 75-NM-013). The proposed well is on Bureau of Land Management land in San Juan County, New Mexico.

The entire location and 1151 feet of new road was inspected by a walking survey and the portion of unimproved trail was inspected from a slow moving vehicle. Nothing was found to indicate that the proposed construction would have either direct or indirect adverse effect on cultural resources.

The proposed well is located 890 feet from the north line and 790 feet from the east line of Section 28, Township 30 North, Range 14 West, N.M.P.M.

The well is in a shallow swale opened to the east. Access will be 1.5 miles of improved trail, 1.2 miles of unimproved trail, and 1151 feet of new road entering the site from the south-southwest. The sparse vegetation consists of juniper, snake broomweed, narrow leaf yucca, and grama. The soil is gravelly-sand with sandstone outcrops.
