Re: Completion of Plugging and Abandonment Little Chama Valley #1 660/N; 1980/W, Sec. 9, Township 10North, Range 2 East Rio Arriba County, New Mexico

Dear Mr. Dunnavant:

On October 29, 1971, verbal approval was given by this office for the plugging and abandonment of the above well. Commission Form C-103, Sundry Notice, was filed with this office November 11, 1971, indicating the well plugged and abandoned. Due to weather and road condition an inspection of the location was not made until June 22, 1972, at which time I visited the location. The rig was still standing over the hole. The surface plug was not set; the pits were not filled and leveled as required; and junk and equipment of various kinds were still on the location. For this reason your plugging report has not been approved.

With the advent of winter, it would probably be impossible to finish the above work before next spring. I am, therefore, notifying our attorney in Santa Fe, Mr. George Hatch, to set a hearing date to have you and the bonding company show cause why abandonment procedures should not be completed. I am requesting that Mr. Hatch not take such action until October 15, 1972, so that you will have time to voluntarily comply prior to that date.

When the work is completed and the location ready for inspection, please notify me by letter so that a final inspection may be made.
