

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.



ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT FOR THE YEAR 1912

The Bureau of Land Management, under the direction of the Commissioner, has during the year 1912, been engaged in the following work:

1. The acquisition of public lands for the purpose of establishing national forests and game reserves.

2. The disposal of public lands for the purpose of raising revenue for the Government.

3. The management of the public lands for the purpose of conserving the natural resources thereof.

4. The survey of public lands for the purpose of determining their extent and location.

5. The establishment of national monuments and preserves.

6. The management of the public lands for the purpose of promoting the development of the same.

7. The acquisition of public lands for the purpose of establishing national parks.

8. The disposal of public lands for the purpose of raising revenue for the Government.

9. The management of the public lands for the purpose of conserving the natural resources thereof.

10. The survey of public lands for the purpose of determining their extent and location.
