DETAILS OF WORK

This well was spudded on July 6, 1957, and on July 7, 1957, 8-5/8" casing was set at 362' with 250 sacks of cement. After waiting on cement for 24 hours, casing and water shut off were tested with 400 pounds pressure for 30 minutes with no drop in pressure.
