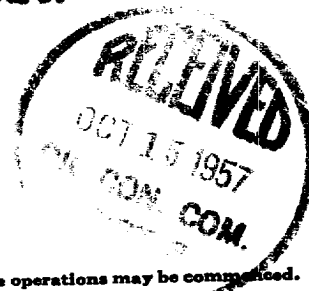

DETAILS OF WORK

(State names of and expected depths to objective sands; show sizes, weights, and lengths of proposed casings; indicate mudding jobs, cementing points, and all other important proposed work)

On September 16, 1957, a cast iron bridge plug was set on wire line at 2436'. 5 1/2" casing was perforated from 2388' to 2434' with four shots per foot. This well was then re-sand oil fracked with 20,000 gallons oil and 20,000 pounds sand. Formation broke at 2200 pounds pressure. Average injection rate 64 barrels per minute. Potential test 10/10/57 91 barrels of oil in 24 hours.
