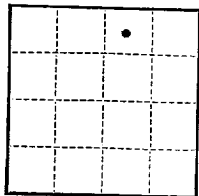

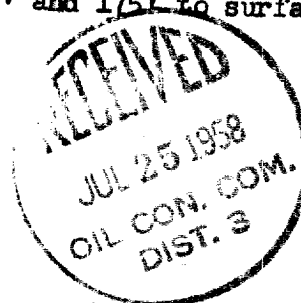

## DETAILS OF WORK

Notice is hereby given of intention to abandon the Ute Mountain Tribal 2-29#2 at a total depth of 902 feet because two joints of 8 5/8" surface pipe parted. Bottom of surface pipe is 137 feet and the top of the fish is 722 feet. A cement plug will be spotted from 902'-700' and 175' to surface. The rig will be skidded 50 feet to the East.



I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
