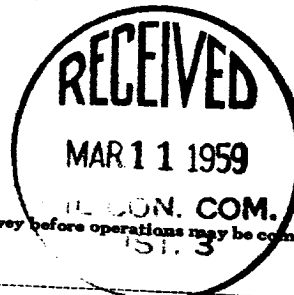

DETAILS OF WORK

This well was spudded 4:00 P.M., 3-3-59. Drilled 12-1/4" hole to 104' SIM. Ran 3 joints 8-5/8" O.D. 24# J-55 casing = 95.65'. Set at 103.65' and cemented with 115 sacks common cement plus 3% CaCl. Job complete 10:00 P.M., 3-3-59. W.O.C. 12 hours. Released pressure and nipped up BOP's. Tested 8-5/8" O.D. casing with 550# for 30 Minutes, O.K. Resumed drilling at 12:00 Noon, 3-4-59.
