DETAILS OF WORK

The following sand-oil fracture treatment was performed on Nov. 15, 1962:

Sand-oil fractured 1840' to 2020' (open hole) with 27,046 gal. oil and 30,000 lbs. of size 10-20 sand. Formation broke and took treatment at 1800 p.s.i.; injection rate 36 b.p.m. Flushed with 2100 gallons of oil; Immediate shut in pressure, 200 p.s.i. After 12 hours, well was opened and free oil level immediately dropped to 1840' below ground level.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
