DETAILS OF WORK

A string of 8-5/8" casing was set at a depth of 239 ft. and was cemented with 150 sacks of neat cement. Approximately 20 sq of cement were circulated to surface. After WOC for 24 hours, the casing was tested with 1000 psi water pressure for 30 minutes. No drop in pressure was noted during the test.
