It is understood that this unit is to be dedicated to your Nickels Well No. 1, located in Unit K of said Section 11.

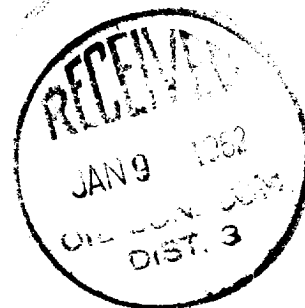

I have your letter of the 10th inst. regarding the proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution which would give the Legislature the power to create a new judicial branch of government. I am sorry that I cannot give you a more definite answer at this time, but the Commission is still in the process of studying the proposed amendment and its effect on the existing judicial branch of government.

The Commission is composed of representatives from the various branches of government and the public, and we are all working to reach a consensus on this important issue. We have held several public hearings and received many suggestions from the citizens of Arizona. We are currently reviewing these suggestions and will be holding another public hearing in the near future. I will keep you informed of our progress as we move forward.

I am sure that you will understand the need for thoroughness in this process. We are committed to ensuring that any proposed amendment to the Constitution is in the best interests of the people of Arizona. We will continue to work hard to reach a fair and equitable solution to this complex issue.
