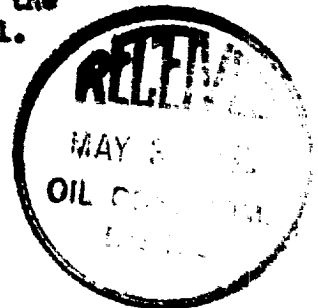
1. Drilling operations so authorized are subject to the attached sheet for general conditions of approval.
