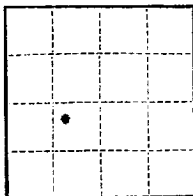

DETAILS OF WORK

The Navajo-Ute 6 #1 was plugged and abandoned on February 13, 1958. The perforations from 1734' to 1718' were squeezed with 50 sq sack cement. A 20' cement plug was spotted in the top of the 9-5/8" casing. A 10' piece of 1 1/2" line pipe was left standing in the casing with 4' above ground.

The location has been cleaned and is presently ready for inspection.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
