Gentlemen:

Recently Form C-122-B, Initial Potential Test Data Sheet, was filed on a well in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 10-32N-11W. Our records indicate proper designation on this well is the McMillan-White #1 Maddox, as that is the operator who drilled the well and we have no notification of any change in operator. However, the Form C-122-B above mentioned indicates Critchell Parsons is now operator. We cannot approve change of operator on this well until Form C-110 has been filed. This form should be filed by the new operator and the details of the ownership transfer should be given in the space marked "Remarks".

We would also like to point out that the drilling unit as submitted on Gas Well Flat by McMillan and White indicates that this is a non-standard unit, in that it contains 335.6 acres, being all of partial section 10-32N-11W. Order R-128-D Rule 1 states that a standard gas proration unit must contain 316 to 324 acres. As your unit is larger, this will have to have administrative approval of this unit. You may secure approval by complying with the provisions of Order R-128-D, Rule 1, paragraph B, copy of which is enclosed.

We will not be able to approve form C-110, which is the authorization to transport form, on this well until you have secured approval on the unit as outlined above.
