

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO
NATURAL GAS COMPANY FOR A
DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1694

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 24, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Allison Unit Well No. 27 located in Unit A of Section 30, Township 32 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 14th day of December, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED;

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Allison Unit Well No. 27 located in Unit A of Section 30, Township 32 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL AND GAS COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A, the Commission has received an application from the applicant for a permit to drill a well in the Allison Unit No. 27 located in Unit A of Section 33, Township 33 North, Range 2 West, T10N, R2W, S34W, New Mexico, and the Basin-Park Pool, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Basin-Park Pool.

Now, on this 14th day of December, 1961, the Commission orders that:

- (1) That the applicant has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That the applicant's application has been received.
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed in said rule.
- (4) That the proposed completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the completion of the proposed well and the production therefrom will be in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to drill, complete, operate and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, and the Basin-Park Pool, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Basin-Park Pool, and the Basin-Park Pool through parallel strings of lateral

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply, at least, with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take primary leasehold upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test period for the Basin-Park Pool.
