Dear Mr. Leisk:

We have your letter of June 2, 1969, inquiring about the producing status of a well you refer to as #1-16 Frankel, $N_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Section 16-31N-13W. I am enclosing a copy of Form C-104 filed by Lloyd B. Taylor who assumed operation of the well in July, 1967. You will note that the well is now identified as the "Vic Walker Com #1". Mr. Taylor states that the well is to be plugged and abandoned in the Dakota formation and recompleted in the Gallup formation.

We have checked the production records back to July of 1968 and find that there has been none reported although the well is listed by Southern Union Gathering Company as a connection and notice of a disconnection has never been filed.

I presume that the well has had no production since Mr. Taylor assumed operation.
